





MVT Residents Who Lived Within One Mile of Their Job [Pre-Pandemic]











While There Has been Decline in MVT's Office Market...

























Perceptions of Green Space Availability






### **Mount Vernon Triangle Community Foundation**

We specifically fulfill our mission through initiatives that align with one of these four focus areas:




- Providing enhanced support for the maintenance and capital repair needs of our valuable-yet-limited parks and open space resources as well as other public space assets.




